




SCIENCE OLYMPIAD: all students attending the Purdue competition please come down to Ms. Peterson's room during advisory or after school to pick up your parent permission slip.

Step 1: Sign Up

Step 2: Rally your sponsors

Ask parents, friends, and neighbors to pledge 5 cents or more per book you read. For example, if a sponsor pledges 10 cents per book and you read 10 books, they should give \$1.

Step 3: READ, READ & READ

Make sure you choose books at your reading level! Write the names of the books you read on the Book List Record. Parents/guardians, please initial next to each book completed.

Step 4: Collect pledges

Take the Book List Record back to your sponsors to show them the total number of books you have read! Use your book record envelope to collect pledges from your sponsors and return it to Ms. Rose or your local library branch. Students who participate will be eligible for prizes!!!!


